volunteer host committee. Plus, Mandi's oldest son attends Elachee Nature Academy (ENA).

Mandi and husband, Adam, along with their three children, 5-year-old Brady and 16-month-old twins, Davis and Owen, are now regulars at Elachee. Brady went to Camp Elachee this past summer and was thrilled to play in a creek. In August, he joined ENA's Kindergarten class. Her son's love of Elachee spurred Mandi to serve on the *Flights'* organizing committee last spring, which has evolved into her chairing the 20th annual event, taking place Saturday evening, April 25, 2020.

"Full Media's owner, Kris Nordholz, is very big on giving back to the community, allowing his employees time to volunteer for an organization that they're passionate about. For me, that's Elachee," Mandi explains. "I believe in the importance of Elachee's mission, to educate people about nature and to provide a beautiful place for families to enjoy nature, by preserving the Chicopee Woods."

One of Mandi's goals as the *2020 Flights of Fancy* volunteer chair is to introduce as many new people as possible to Elachee "so that they can also benefit from this incredible resource."

This fun social event brings together some 250 friends and supporters on Elachee's outdoor patio for a farm-to-table dinner, auction and lively activities. Area businesses and individuals get involved with this annual fundraiser through sponsorships and by donating nature- and outdoor-themed items and experiences.

Brady is a constant reminder to Mandi of Elachee's value.

"Every day he's so excited to talk about what he saw and what he did," she shares. "The children are learning what they would in a traditional classroom. What's different is the way the teachers get the students excited by incorporating nature into the lessons. It's genius!"

Brady is also spreading the word. "He tells everyone he meets that he goes to 'nature school,' and how much fun it is," confides



this resident of Braselton, Ga. "So many of my friends are amazed when I post pictures on social media of him at Elachee. They'll say, 'Where is that beautiful school? What a cool place!"

New Walnut Creek Bridge

If you hiked in Chicopee Woods this summer and early fall, you likely saw piles of wood along the trails. Among recent updates to the hiking trail system is a newly constructed pedestrian bridge across Walnut Creek. This 35-foot bridge, along the Bridge Loop,



replaced a 15-year-old structure that was showing visible signs of stress due to age, wear and pressure from forceful stream flow. Volunteers carried lumber to the construction site, staging it along the way, then reversed the process to remove the old bridge debris from the Nature Preserve.

Some 65,000 hikers and joggers travel across this Walnut Creek Bridge each year. Elachee's Volunteer Trail Crew actively maintained the previous bridge as this pedestrian access point is vital to the hiking trail system. However, earlier this year Elachee's Natural Resources Manager, Lee Irminger, elevated priority to replace it. Thanks to a grant from REI Co-op along with a generous 'gap' donation from an avid Chicopee Woods hiker, bridge replacement and construction began in June.

From a pick-up truck, to an ATV, the trail crew then teamed up to hand-carry each 16-foot board another tenth of a mile along the trails to the construction site. A contractor worked to demolish the old bridge and construct the new bridge. Volunteers from ZF-Gainesville LLC worked alongside the trail crew to haul the old bridge debris out of the Preserve.

"The bridge helps people view a wilderness area in the middle of an urban sprawl," says Trail Crew Volunteer Dave Mc Carroll.

This bridge marks the first of many to be replaced as part of

Elachee's ongoing upkeep of the Preserve trails.
