Students Granted Access to Nature

Grant Award Provides 7,200 Students Science Education Programming

Thanks to a \$15,000 grant award from the Jackson EMC Foundation, funded by the contributions of the cooperative's members, some 7,200 students (PreK-12) have,

and will benefit from Elachee's innovative programming this school year. Funding helped subsidize a portion of student program fees for Elachee's STEAM-based (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics) nature education field trips to the Nature Center and *Elachee in Your*



Classroom outreach classes for schools unable to bring their students to Elachee. Grant funding has been made available to schools throughout the cooperative's 10-county service area. Elachee's grade-appropriate curriculum correlates with the Georgia Standards for Excellence (GSE) and Gwinnett County Public Schools Academic Knowledge and Skills (AKS). Each year, nearly 35,000 children and teens from dozens of Georgia school systems and home school programs, engage in memorable and meaningful educational experiences at Elachee, the only nature center in the southeastern U.S. accredited by the Southern Association for Colleges and Schools (SACS/AdvancED).

Greetings from the Chicopee Woods

Seasoned hikers make a point of calling out, "Hi," when passing these trees, seen from the Lake Loop, that are forged together via a 'pressure graft.' Not only is this natural phenomenon a sight to behold, the results of the Elachee Volunteer Trail Crew's ongoing hiking trails work in the Chicopee Woods Nature Preserve is another!

This volunteer corps, managed by Elachee Nature Science Center, had a productive December and January. The following recaps the Elachee Trail Crew's recent efforts.

- Repaired one Lake Loop bridge and structurally reinforced another.
- Constructed and installed a map pedestal at the start of the Bridge Loop.
- Added trail blaze markers to the directional signage at the intersection of the Bridge Loop/ Lake Loop to enhance hiker navigation.
- Added water bars to the Bridge Loop/Lake Loop overlap to protect the trail from erosion.
- Closed an unofficial side trail near the rock staircase on the Bridge Loop/Lake Loop overlap to protect the land from degradation.
- Removed aged railing from the bridge on the Lake Loop (pictured at right).
- Removed 12 blowdown trees from the trail system.

The Trail Crew also routinely removes dirt, leaves and debris from pedestrian bridges and steps along this 8-mile trail system. Ongoing maintenance is important to protect these structures from break down, caused by soil and natural debris. Elachee's Natural Resources Manager Lee Irminger, with help from the Trail Crew and third party experts, keeps a vigilant eye on all trail system bridges. A January 2020 inspection helped him prioritize routine maintenance schedules for each.

Of note, the bridge over Vulture Rock Creek (Lake Loop), previously identified as needing structural improvements, is ready for construction. Volunteer engineers and bridge builders have developed a plan to improve its condition. Elachee is grateful to Builders First Source of Gainesville who will be donating the materials, as well as an anonymous donor who has donated power tools. The Elachee Trail Crew will perform the work.

How You Can Protect the Nature Preserve While Hiking

This hiking trail system has been purposefully built to a relatively narrow path to limit degradation of the surrounding environment. Lee encourages hikers to travel the trails single file and stay on the official trails. Keep dogs leashed Saturday and Sunday. No dogs Monday through Friday. TRAIL MAPS: elachee.org/hiking-trails

STAFF PROFILE Wes Hatch

Education Programs Specialist **Wes Hatch** joined the Elachee team in August. Hike with Wes and he'll share why the path sparkles in the sunlight (mica in the rocks), which acorns are the most nutritious and tasty for foragers (those from the White Oak) and why an Orange Witch's Hat Mushroom has funny white lines etched across its cap (a slug did it).



"I get to be outside, work with animals and people at Elachee," Wes explains. "But I don't just teach other people about nature. I get to learn something new and grow as a person every day."

Much of what Wes does is guide children in exploring diversity of the natural world during their field trips here and in *Elachee in Your Classroom* outreach programs.

"I love it when kids realize how cool nature is. I encourage them to touch things, get a little dirt and mud on their hands." Wes will also be the Camp Elachee 2020 staff liaison for the Counselors-in-Training leadership program.

Spring and fall, Wes conducts Saturday demonstrations for Elachee visitors. He enables them to interact with residents of Elachee's live animal exhibit. He will also lead guided Saturday hikes in Chicopee Woods, planned throughout 2020.

Birding, however, is his passion. "I've been a big birder for 10 years," he shares. "I have been around the U.S. and to every county in Georgia to look for birds."
