Irreplaceable Natural Resource

Whether you hike once a year or more frequently traverse the hiking trails in one of Georgia's largest protected green spaces, the 1,440-acre Chicopee Woods Nature Preserve, Elachee is looking out for you.

Elachee is conservator in perpetuity for the Nature Preserve, under a land management agreement with the

Chicopee Woods Area Park Commission (CWAPC). Neither CWAPC nor Elachee receive any federal, state or local government funding to perform the conservation stewardship work that restores and protects the health of this regional treasure – its forest, streams and habitats – including the 12-mile hiking trail system.

The hiking trails connect Elachee's Visitor Center campus with Elachee's Aquatic Studies Center at Chicopee Lake. To operate and maintain the hiking trail system, Elachee relies on annual donations and volunteer support from individuals and community partners. This symbiotic relationship keeps the irreplaceable recreational resource pristine and accessible for our guests.

HIKING TRAIL UPDATES

Elachee Volunteer Trail Crew's current projects:

TRAIL SIGNAGE To simplify navigation, there are trail name changes prompting signage updates. What's different? The newly named Bridge Trail starts where the Suspension Bridge intersects the West Lake Trail, extending east to its intersection with East Lake Trail. For reference, the Dunlap Trail formerly overlapped sections of the West Lake and East Lake Trails. Dunlap has now been limited to a beautiful portion of the trail that spurs off of West Lake Trail and runs down to and along Homestead Creek before reconnecting back to West Lake Trail.

TRAIL RELOCATION With the design phase complete, the Trail Crew is constructing a new portion of the Bridge Trail near the Suspension Bridge that will reroute it away from an existing staircase slated for removal. This new section of trail will have a slight grade that will not require a staircase, ultimately requiring less long-term maintenance.

TRAIL MAINTENANCE Recent bridge inspections revealed that component boards required replacement. These small bridge repairs are complete. The constant heavy humidity under the forest canopy contributes to the quick breakdown of lumber, necessitating regular maintenance of trail infrastructure.

Partnership Puts Student Scientists on Lake Lanier

Elachee, Chattahoochee Riverkeeper (CRK) and Hall County Parks and Leisure Services recently celebrated a ribbon cutting for the new Lake Lanier Aquatic Learning Center (LLALC) boathouse and two-slip dock at River Forks Park in Gainesville. The LLALC program serves K-12 schools throughout north Georgia, college and universities, church and civic organizations. Its operational costs are funded in part by charitable donations.

"This has been a successful Elachee and CRK collaboration for 18 years and has hosted more than 50,000 students in that time," shares Andrea Timpone. "The move to River Forks Park adds Hall County Parks and Leisure Services to this educational endeavor and gives this important program an excellent home base."

Aboard CRK's catamaran, the *Chota Princess II* floating classroom, Elachee instructors guide students in collecting lake sediments, determining pH and dissolved oxygen levels, sample plankton and measuring turbidity. Then on shore, they engage students in environmental management activities related to the watershed.

"Our partnership is a prime example of three agencies working well together for the greater good of our community," says Mike Little, Director, Hall County Parks and Leisure Services. "It has been a natural fit because our values and philosophies regarding environmental conservation and education line up together so well."

STAFF PROFILE Cindy Andrews Elachee Senior Naturalist

With an effervescent personality that draws you in and captures your imagination, Cindy has been an integral part of the Elachee family



since 1999. So much so, her fingerprint is all over Elachee's incomparable STEAM-based environmental education programs for school children. The past two decades, Cindy's charismatic teaching style has brought to life these ecology concepts for tens of thousands of Georgia students participating in field trips to Elachee. Not surprising to us, Cindy is one of Elachee's most recognized and requested naturalist!

So What Gets Cindy Revved Up?

Of Elachee's 54 grade-specific school programs, Cindy's favorite is *Lessons from the Cherokee*. She relishes giving students a glimpse into the culture, life and history of the remarkable Cherokee Native Americans. Her own fascination with their survival skills and how they lived off the land inspires eye-opening dialogue as students grasp past ways of living.

Another topic Cindy passionately promotes is snake education and awareness. "I hope that more people can learn the benefits of snakes and begin to fear them less," she says. "If you leave a snake alone, it will leave you alone and will most likely help with any pest problems you may have!"

Cindy is one of Elachee's two dozen skilled educators who serve nearly 35,000 PreK-12 students from around the north Georgia region each year through environmental education field trips to the Nature Center and Lake Lanier, and *Elachee in Your Classroom* outreach programs.

Storybook Setting for a Hike

Accessible from multiple locations around the Elachee Visitor Center, the paved half-mile Geiger Trail is tailor-made for easy, low-impact meandering. There is a particularly enchanted section of the Geiger Trail, referred to as the *Storybook Trail*. Here, visitors may leisurely stroll from kiosk to kiosk to read a children's book. At the start of each new school year, the Elachee Nature Academy (ENA) posts an enlarged book reproduction for every visitor to enjoy.

It's fun for the children to discover it first, make it their own and then later bring it to life."
